

Workshop in Field Research / Internship & Research Practicum SOC 193/192

Sociology 193/192 is one of several courses which satisfy the methodology requirement for both the Sociology and Sociology: Organizational Studies A.B. degrees, no matter the emphasis. SOC 193/192 must be taken concurrently.

- Students need to find and secure their own field research experience (one in which they can observe social interactions among 3 or more persons) prior to the first day of class. One's field research experience might include 1) an internship - paid or unpaid, you can find one through the ICC center in South Hall or by contacting companies directly; 2) your paid job experience, 3) volunteer activities, 4) student clubs or organizations, etc. (All of which must be approved by the instructor.)

Students need to sign up for SOC 193 and 192. Two (2.0) units shall be earned for SOC 193 (letter-graded), and anywhere from two to six (2.0 – 6.0) units for 192 (P/NP grade option). To determine how many hours you will need to commit to per week at your field research experience, please review the “Field Research Guidelines” and “Time Commitment and Unit Value” information on the reverse side of this flyer.

Notes:

- **Although priority registration is given to graduating seniors, any registered Sociology major with senior standing may enroll in this course and juniors may receive permission to enroll only after consultation with a major advisor. SOC 46A, CMN 102, or PSC 41 is a pre-requisite.**
- The class will meet once a week for two hours, and students will turn in field notes from their field research experience on a weekly basis. The course instructor will hand out a more detailed syllabus on the first day. Although the department chair is listed as the ‘instructor of record’, qualified advanced graduate students teach the course.
- Students will learn to do research, take field notes, read materials related to the course, give class presentations, and submit a 10-page research paper for SOC 193, all in addition to the hours of field work required for SOC 192 units.

FIELD RESEARCH GUIDELINES

Time Commitment and Unit Value*

The number of units awarded is contingent upon the degree of commitment to the field research setting. The basic formula is one unit of credit per three hours per week commitment for ten week period.

<u>Commitment Per Week</u>	<u>Units</u>
6 - 8 hours	2
9-11 hours	3
12-14 hours	4
15-17 hours	5
18-20 hours	6
