

# GENERAL EMPHASIS (A.B.)



The general emphasis enables students to develop a broader perspective of sociology by providing three sequenced levels of education in Sociology:

- I. Introduction to the discipline, its central issues, and ways of thinking.
- II. Learning of basic sociological skills and concepts and achievement of breadth of knowledge in substantive subfields of sociology.
- III. Concentration in subfield to attain depth of knowledge and analytic skills.
